As you read, take notes about the major events, characters, and motifs in order to prepare

for your first assignments of the year that will be about your novel. You should take notes

either in your book (underlining key lines, writing notes in the margin, or using sticky notes

that help you to process the work) or in a composition notebook. Looking for patterns

(repeated words, images, references) may be helpful, and you should be sure to mark them.

Also, writing chapter-by-chapter notes (either in the book at the end of each chapter or in a

composition notebook) will enable you to recall the details of this work when we begin

class in August.

Taking detailed notes will help prepare you for the first assessments of senior year, which

will include a reading quiz and an in-class essay.
