11th Grade Summer Reading Assignment

Welcome to British Literature! I'm excited to be teaching you in the upcoming school year.

Before we come back in August, you'll need to complete a summer reading assignment. All students will be required to choose a book from the list below. Those in the **Honors Class will be required to read two**. When you read your novel, do so very carefully. You should take notes in your book, underlining key lines or writing notes in the margin that help you to process the work (or use post-its with key details. Looking for patterns (repeated words, images, references) will be helpful and you should be sure to mark them. Also, highlighting events important to the plot will enable you to recall the details of each story when we begin British Literature class in the fall. Be prepared to use highlights and notes to study for the quiz on your novel(s) in the first few days of class. (Hint: SparkNotes will not be enough to do well on the quiz.)

Note: In case of failure, students may show significant notes or post-its in the book to make up points (or notes added to the ebook)—no points will be given for notes outside of the book.
